# Road Safety Week



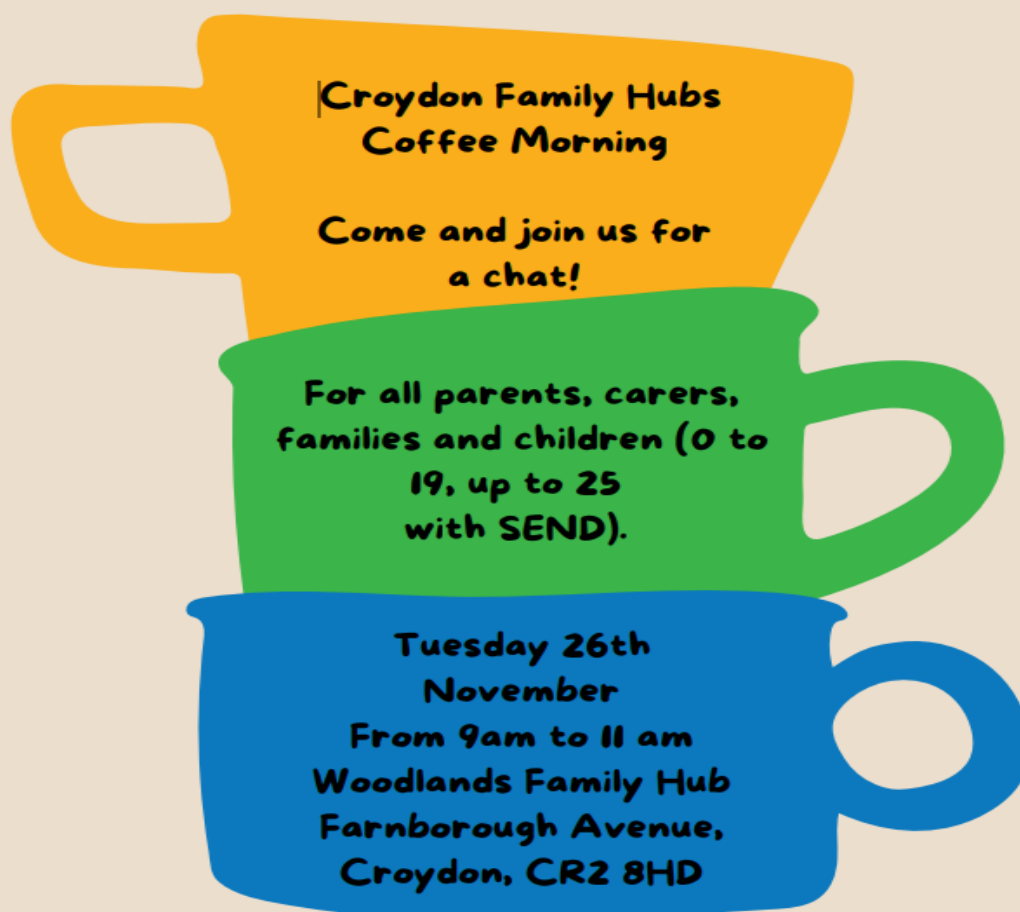
