A huge welcome to our new parents and children! This is your Autumn 1 home learning sheet. Please keep it safe at home and try the different activities, ticking them off as you go! It is up to you when, how and in what order you do these activities. These activities are in addition to weekly homework, spellings and reading.

Reception activities to enjoy at home

Activity tick list

- Play a board game with your friends and family, playing board games will help you learn to share, take turns, win, lose and count.
- To help your child's fine motor skills (hand strength) do lots of activities involving playdough, cutting with child safe scissors and threading activities.
- Practise holding a pencil correctly (tripod grip) and learn to write your name by yourself using lower case letters (not capital letters.)
- Log onto You Tube (parental supervision required) and look for "Read Write inc speed sounds set 1" - this is the phonic scheme we use at Kenley and it would help your child to become familiar with some of the sounds and rhymes.
- Practise reading and writing numbers to 5 and then 10.
- Practise reading and writing high frequency words, these are words we use in many aspects of our lives, and it is good for children to become very familiar with them: **mum, dad, cat, dog, I, my, like, can, big, see, me, we, she, he, and, the, love, to, in, up, on, get, it, you.**
- Read to your child every day, encourage them to join in with the story and repeat parts of the story using the pictures to help them.
- Help your child become independent and encourage them to put on their own shoes and wellies.
- Help your child put on and zip up their coats.
- Talk about how important it is to wash and dry their hands properly, discuss what germs are and how to get rid of them.
- Teach your child how to use cutlery properly and cut up their own food.
- Do puzzles or colouring activities with your child to help them learn how to listen and sit still for a short amount of time.
