Section 1 - Flying High – Croydon's Airports and Airfields

Look at the list below and choose **one** of the tasks to complete:

- Find out about the English pilot Amy Johnson. Research her life and her achievements. Present what you have found out about her in a format of your choice, e.g. a poster, a fact file, a PowerPoint presentation etc.
- Use a range of materials / resources to build a model aeroplane (you could use junk modelling or even Lego).
- Visit Kenley airfield and photograph anything of historical interest that you spot. Find out some interesting facts about Kenley airfield to share with the class.
- Choose a type of aircraft and draw an image of it, clearly labelling and describing the different parts.

Section 2 – Everyday Materials



Look at the list below and choose **one** of the tasks to complete:

- Research one of the following famous inventors / scientists: John Dunlop, Charles Macintosh or John McAdam. Present your information in a format of your choice, e.g. poster, fact file, PowerPoint presentation or a news report.
- Choose one of the inventors mentioned above and produce an image of them. You can use any art medium e.g. paint, pencil, crayons, photo image or a computer or drawing software programme. Label the image with their name and add a caption to explain what they invented and when.
- Think of an invention that can be used to help the environment. Draw and label it. It could be a robot of some kind or a new material.

Section 3 - Reading

Look at the list below and choose **one** of the tasks to complete:

- Take a photograph of you reading in your favourite place and send it to me on Class Dojo. Explain why this is your favourite place and how it makes you feel. We will share your ideas and the photograph with the class.
- Reading is one of the most important skills to learn in life. Take 10 photographs of different objects / places in your local environment that highlight the importance of learning to read, e.g. a sign in a shop, instructions for cooking, a road sign. Send them to us via email, explaining your thoughts.
