Dear Parents and Carers

I am writing to you as we approach the end of another academic year, as usual, I would like to mention some of this year's highlights.

We were pleased to welcome both Katie Turner and Jacki Keogh to the school in September 2023. On their arrival the school updated its mission to align with the TCT "Exceptional Education for All" vision and simplified Kenley's values to be that of Ambition, Responsibility and Community. To strengthen these values within the school, the "Kenley Way" was also introduced to the children, for them to be ready, be respectful and be safe.

As you know since September 2021, we have been part of The Collegiate Trust. This year, the Education Team for The Collegiate Trust have offered ongoing support to.

- Embed approaches to Early Reading and Phonics
- Support with writing moderation in Years 2 and 6
- Developing our teaching approaches in Maths across the school

We have also received wider support from colleagues in our family of schools.

- Working with Mr Weeks (Head of College VI) to develop the Primary Student Teaching and Mentoring Programme (STAMP).
- Year 12 and 13 students have worked with our Pupil Parliamentarians to develop playground games.
- Others have read with children with the aim of promoting reading for pleasure.

The school have supported the local community through our Macmillan coffee morning, raising £369 for this worthy cause and through your harvest donations given to the local Whyteleafe Food Hub for families in need.

The PTA organised an incredible Fireworks Spectacular and Sip, Shop & Mingle Christmas event which raised over £3,000 for the school.

In December, all KS1 children were given the opportunity of visiting the Beauty & the Beast pantomime in Redhill and shared their acting and singing skills when they took part in their own nativity performance in early December.
