### Safer Internet Day

Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> February is National Safer Internet Day with the theme 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'. With access to digital technology becoming increasingly the norm, it is important that we work with our children to ensure that they know how to keep themselves safe online and that they know how to treat others online. We know that most of our pupils have access to tablets, phones and computers and that social media has become a common vehicle used by young people to communicate. However, it is important to understand the age restrictions in place for the platforms available and ensure that children understand how to use these platforms responsibly.

There are several websites which provide really useful information and access to training to help guide parents through the digital world. I would encourage you to not only look at these resources, but also to speak to your child about staying safe online and what is and isn't appropriate behaviour when using digital technology. I have also attached a 'Respect' guide to this newsletter which provides some useful tips for you to talk through with your child/ren.
