## **Activity tick list**

- Continue to learn to write your name by yourself using lower case letters that are formed correctly.
- Write words and simple sentences independently using phonic sounds and common exception words correctly. For example: **The cat is hot. I like the cat.**
- Log onto You Tube (parental supervision required) and look for "Read Write Inc speed sounds set 1"- to revisit the sounds we have learnt at school.
- Practise reading and writing numbers to **5, 10 and 20.**
- Practise reading and writing common exception words, these are words we use in many aspects of our lives and it is good for children to become very familiar with them: **mum, dad, cat, dog, I, my, like, can, big, see, me, we, she, he, and, the, love, to, in, up, on, get, it, you.**
- Read to your child every day, encourage them to join in with the story and repeat parts of the story using the pictures to help them. Encourage them to answer open-ended questions about what they have read- this will encourage their explanation skills.
- Do puzzles or colouring activities with your child to help them learn how to listen and sit still for a short amount of time.
- Play a board game with your friends and family, playing board games will help you learn to share, take turns, win, lose and count.
- Continue to develop your child's fine motor skills (hand strength) do lots of activities involving playdough, cutting with child safe scissors and threading activities.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Practise reading and writing common exception words which are sent home to you every 2 weeks.</li><li>○ Read to your child every day, encourage them to join in with the story and repeat parts of the story using the pictures to help them.</li><li>○ Teach your child to become more independent and encourage them to put on their own shoes and wellies.</li><li>○ Teach your child to zip up their coats especially as the weather is changing.</li></ul>
