

During the partial school closure due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Kenley Primary School has continued to support our SEN children in a variety of ways:

- A risk assessment for those pupils who have an EHCP or SEND needs, which put them in a vulnerable category, has been carried out with the input of families.
- Those whose needs could be best met in school, have been invited to attend on either a full time or part time basis.
- Parents of pupils with Speech and Language needs have been provided with the SALT helpline number that they can ring to gain advice
- Children who access specialist SALT have been contacted by our therapist
- Further resources and support information for children requiring SALT have been added to the SEND section of the school website.
- In order to support mental health and wellbeing, the staff who support pupils who access ELSA, have contacted the pupils on a weekly basis.
- A wellbeing area has been set up on the school website with resources for parents and pupils to support wellbeing during this time.
- SEND pupils have been contacted regularly by the class teachers and home learning has been differentiated according to individuals pupil needs.
- Where pupils have had no or limited access to ICT, the school has provided home learning packs, which have been delivered to families.
- Our SENCO has liaised with secondary colleagues to support transition for our Year 6 pupils with SEND
- Our SENCO has continued to liaise with external agencies such as Early Help, NSPCC, SALT, Educational Psychology and CAHMS in order to ensure that referrals are made where necessary and parents continue to receive appropriate levels of support.
- 'Team around the Family' meetings have continued online in a virtual form, to ensure that support is ongoing.
- Croydon's SEN update for parents has been made available on our school website
- Annual EHCP reviews have been arranged for the Summer 2 term and these will include parents on site or via virtual access
