

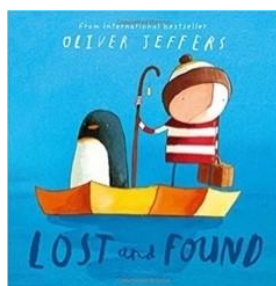

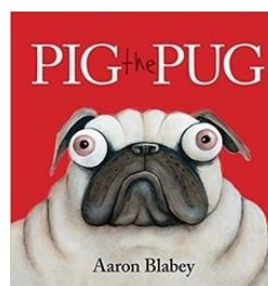

Focus areas for English outcomes



Apply phonic knowledge and skills as the route to decode words
Read accurately by blending sounds in unfamiliar words
Read words containing taught graphemes and -s, -es, -ing, -ed, -er and -est endings
Read words with contractions
Saying out loud what they are going to write about
Composing a sentence orally before writing it
Sequencing sentences to form short narratives
Re-reading what they have written to check that it makes sense

Grammar focus

Joining words and joining clauses using and
Sequencing sentences to form short narratives.
Expanded noun phrases to describe and specify, e.g., the blue butterfly.
Subordination (using when, if, that, or because) and co-ordination (using or, and, or but)
Correct choice and consistent use of present tense and past tense throughout writing

Maths focus areas

Place Value: Counting and understanding within 100, one more and one less, use the number line to 100, compare and order numbers to 100.
Multiplication and division: Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, recognise equal groups, make arrays, make doubles
Fractions: Recognise and find a half of an object or a shape, Recognise and find a quarter of an object or a shape
Geometry: Describe turns, describe position, ordinal numbers
Money: Recognise coins, recognise notes, count in coins
Time: Days of the week, months of a year, hours minutes and seconds

<p>Foundation subjects</p>	<p>History: Transport through time: How and why have trams and trains in Croydon changed since the 1930s? Geography: UK weather, the poles, and the equator Science: Plants – name a variety of common wild and garden plants. Computing: Programming – moving a robot Music: Your imagination – using instruments and voices DT: Food – preparing fruit and vegetables PSHE: Health and wellbeing RE: How did the universe come to be?: Christianity and Hinduism</p>
<p>PE day (and kit expectations)</p>	<p>Your child's PE day will be on a Monday. Your child should wear their PE kit to school, with their school jumper on top. The PE kit should consist of a pale blue T-shirt or polo shirt, plain navy bottoms, and plimsolls/trainers. The school must teach the National Curriculum and PE is a vital element of this. <p>Ways to help at home</p>  	<p>The children in Year 1 will be given books that contain words with the phonics sounds that they are currently learning. The stories will have words with the sounds they need to be practising. Therefore, it is important that the children practise reading those story books a couple times a week. This will help them become more familiar with those sounds and they will be ready to learn new sounds. Please practice reading regularly with your child at home.</p> <p>The children will have access to 'Numbots' which contains a range of activities that relate to topics we cover in class. Your child will have their own account and password for 'Numbots' and they can use this to engage with the activities.</p> <p>Your child will also have assignments set on Splash learn. This is a maths website that they have access to at school and at home. The website is available at https://uk.splashlearn.com/signin#/parent and numeracy games can be played from any computer with internet access. It is linked to the national curriculum objectives for your child's year and there are games set to also revise key knowledge and skills. Your child will be able to practice core skills in a fun and exciting way. For more information, please feel free to ask any questions.</p>
